The History of Redlands Fire Department

Chief Jeff Frazier, Speaker Monday, January 26, 2015 at 7:00 p.m. Assembly Room, A.K. Smiley Public Library 125 W. Vine Street

Chief Jeff Frazier will present the history of the Redlands Fire Department at the January 26th meeting of Redlands Area Historical Society. Chief Frazier joined the Redlands department in 2008 bringing 36 years of fire service experience.

Chief Frazier began his career as a volunteer fire-fighter for Twentynine Palms Fire Department. He completed 28 years with the San Diego Fire Department holding assignments in operations, human resources, training, emergency management, communications and logistics. He was awarded four exceptional service citations during this time.

Elected by his fellow fire chiefs, Chief Frazier is currently President of the Citrus Belt Fire Chiefs

Only two families occupied the house between 1919 and 2000 at which time the house received a Heritage Award. Mr. Claborn was a retired Texas rancher. His wife's maiden name was Swogger and she was proud of a citation given her for helping during an early typhoid epidemic. She lived in the house until 1942. Frank and Julia Volock also loved this park side house encouraging their children to play there. Frank worked as a chef at the popular Phil's Charcoal Broiler and Julia also worked in various businesses in Redlands.




