EXPONENTIAL GROWTH OF THE POSTWAR PERIOD

Dr. Nathan Gonzales, Speaker Monday, January 23, 2017 at 7:00 p.m. Assembly Room, A.K. Smiley Public Library 125 W. Vine Street

DR. NATHAN GONZALES, the present archivist and head of special collections at A.K. Smiley Public Library, will present a program on "The Exponential Growth of the Postwar Period" to the Redlands Area Historical Society.

Gonzales has a passion for the architecture from the late 1940s to 1960's that includes the Mid-Century Modern era. The Heritage Room has documented the special building segments that the Redlands Daily Facts featured weekly. The special home editions noted the new subdivisions in Redlands and promoted the homes with their building plans, contractors, architects and photos.

After World War II Redlands architects designed new homes to house employees of Norton Air Force Base, Lockheed Propulsion, Hosiery Mill, and Universal Rundle to name a few new industries. Redlands built modern business buildings and new churches that exhibited entirely new architecture.

OLD HOUSE GROUP

WE ARE EXCITED to tell you that for the first time we are having a neo-Craftsman home on tour, owned by Dan and Carmen Jones at 1363 Knoll Road. This home is very special in that it was custom designed and built a few years ago to reflect a Craftsman style, circa 1910 with Japanese influence. Local architect Shan McNaughton helped design the structure with builder Rod Dierking of Redlands.

All the baseboards and window frames are made from antique mahogany wood directly from the La Posada Hotel that was located in downtown Redlands. The Gregory Family who owned the hotel had stored many of the building parts in a local warehouse and Mr. Dierking was fortunate enough to purchase the wood for this house.

The light fixtures are all made to replicate Craftsman style from a local Orange County lighting manufacturer. The huge kitchen with subway tile, mahogany cabinets, and large Wolf range is a cook's dream! The exterior has concrete shingles, resembling wood shakes and are all hand cut. There are approximately 22,000 bricks for the circular
