DENNIS HANSBERGER REMINISCES AS COUNTY SUPERVISOR

Dennis Hansberger served 24 years on the San Bernardino County Board of Supervisors representing Redlands as part of the Third District. At one time, Hansberger was the youngest chairman of the board in county history.

Hansberger is the featured speaker for the Redlands Area Historical Society January 22 meeting at 7:00 p.m. in the A. K. Smiley Public Library Assembly Room.

Hansberger graduated from Redlands High in 1960. He attended Valley College and then the University of California, Riverside majoring in geology. His stint with county government began in 1968 as an assistant to Supervisor Donald C. Beckord until 1972.

Municipal issues attracted Hansberger to run for the board successfully in 1972-1980. In the 1970s, land use planning and the development of recreation parks claimed the board attention. The winter flood of 1969 led to new county flood control projects. Hansberger was a member of the Local Agency Formation Commission that dealt with boundary adjustments. Hansberger was a member of the South Coast Air Quality District during the early formation. He was a guest speaker for the Environmental Protection Agency on the implementation of the Clean Water Act.

Asked what he considered his most successful accomplishment while serving on the board, Hansberger answered, "from 1996 through 2008 I worked with county management to correct corruption issues with elected and appointed county officials."

The Boys & Girls Club of Redlands is named for Hansberger, who was able to secure \$4 million in Federal money for the construction of the 2003 club house on Lawton Street.

Hansberger was also a board member and president of the Southern California Association of Governments as well as a member and vice-president of the County Supervisors Association of California.

Historical Society programs are free and open to the public.


