# MENTONE-CRAFTON HISTORY: NEW DISCOVERIES

Marie Reynolds, Speaker Monday, January 27, 2020, at 7:00 p.m. A.K.S.P.L. Contemporary Clubhouse 173 S. Eureka Street, Redlands

MARIE REYNOLDS, a devoted Redlands area historian, will present "Mentone-Crafton History: New Discoveries" at the Contemporary Club, 173 S. Eureka Street on January 27<sup>th</sup> at 7:00 p.m.

The Reynolds family once owned the property where the Crafton Retreat began in the 1870s. This connection and an inquisitive historical thirst led Marie Reynolds to research Crafton, Mentone and portions of Greenspot. Her eagerness for learning the area history began decades ago.

For 18 years Marie participated with the Heritage Auxiliary of the Assistance League. Marie lead fourth grade tours of Redlands and researched and co-wrote "Treasures in Hidden Neighborhoods" tours to fund raise for the fourth grade tours. These tours were sell outs.

Marie attended kindergarten at Mentone Elementary School. She graduated from Cal State University, Fullerton with a degree in Business Administration. She has been involved with education and students while living in an 1891 Victorian home with her husband and four children. Marie volunteered as a librarian at Mariposa Elementary School for 10 years. She has served on the boards for Heritage Auxiliary, Redlands Council of PTAs and Redlands Education Partnership Foundation.

Currently Marie is a 20-year member of the Contemporary Club. For the last seven years she's acted as co-advisor for Kimberly Juniors. For over a decade Marie has been a member of the Redlands Area Historical Society board and is the newsletter chair. Attending the Mentone Area Community Association meetings regularly, she became a board member a year ago.

# HERITAGE HOME TRAINING

Would you like to learn how to research homes in Redlands? The A.K. Smiley Public Library Heritage Room and the Redlands Area Historical Society will present a workshop Saturday, January 25<sup>th</sup> at 10:00 a.m. in the Heritage Room.

Workshop attendees will learn the steps usually taken to find the year of construction. How to use the old City Directories, building permits, subdivision maps, Sanborn Insurance maps, The Citrograph file, and City records to find previous owners and modifications to homes will be discussed.

The library has a subscription to Newspapers.com which allows research into both previous owners and stories on homes and subdivisions.

The workshop is a first step for those interested in researching homes in the Redlands area.

Marie Reynolds digs to find the history and significance that makes local history come alive. Her Power-Point program is sure to delight and is free and open to the general public.
